

General Park Rules and Regulations

1. Fires in the Park areas shall be confined to:
 - a. Park camp stoves or fireplaces provided for such purpose.
 - b. Portable stoves in established campsites and picnic area where fires are permitted.
 - c. No fire shall be left unattended and every fire shall be fully and completely extinguished before its user leaves the park area.
2. No Person shall:
 - a. Hunt, pursue, trap, kill, injure, or molest any birds or animals or disturb their habitats.
 - b. Discharge any firearm, pellet gun, bow, and arrow, slingshot or other weapon capable of injuring any person, bird or animal.
 - c. Possess any loaded firearm in any park area except under agreement or special regulation of the City of Winston.
3. Flowers, shrubs, foliage, tree or plant life or products of any type shall not be planted, picked, cut, mutilated or removed from any park area without written permission from the park board.
4. No person shall mutilate, deface, damage or remove any table, bench, building, sign, marker, monument, fence, barrier, fountain, faucet, traffic recorder or other structure or facility of any kind in a park area. This proscription does not include ordinary control or maintenance of park areas or park property by park employees.
5. No person shall, except under special regulation of the Park Board, dig up, deface or remove any dirt, stones, rock or other substances whatever, make any excavation, quarry any stone, or lay or set off any blast, or roll any stones or other objects, or cause or assist in doing any of the said things within a park area.
6. No person shall erect signs, markers or inscriptions of any type within a park area without the permission of the Park Board.
7. Without prior approval of the Park Board no person in a park area may:
 - a. Operate a concession, either fixed or mobile;
 - b. Solicit, sell or offer for sale, peddle, hawk or end any goods, wares, merchandise, food, liquids or services: or
 - c. Advertise any goods or services by any means whatsoever.

8. Motor vehicles shall be operated only on roads and in parking areas constructed or designated for motor vehicle use. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any trail or in any part of a park not constructed or designated for motor vehicle use, or on any road or trail posted as closed to public. Automobiles, trailer or other vehicles shall be parked only in designated parking areas. This subsection shall not apply to control and maintenance of park areas or park property by park employees.
9. No bottles, cans, ashes, waste, paper, garbage, sewage, or refuse shall be left in the park area without the permission of the park board.
10. No person shall set up or use a public address system in the park area without the permission of the Park Board.

11. No person shall ride, drive, lead or keep a saddle horse or other animal in any park area except on such roads, trails or areas designated for that purpose. No horse shall be hitched to any tree or shrub in such a manner that may cause damage to such tree or shrub.

13. No person shall operate or use any noise producing machine, vehicle, device or instrument in such a manner that is disturbing to other park area visitors.
14. no person shall operate any motor vehicle within a park area at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour unless the roadway is posted otherwise.
15. Except for authorized overnight camping in accordance with these Council rules and regulations, no person other than law enforcement officers or authorized City personnel shall enter or remain in any park area between the daily closing time and the daily opening time as established by the Park Board and posted at the entrance to such park area.
16. No Child shall be allowed in any park area unless attended by a person responsible as an adult under the circumstances.
 - a. A child five years old or older is conclusively presumed to require the attendance of a person responsible as an adult in order to be in any park area.
 - b. If a child is above the age of five years and below the age of seven years, there is a rebuttable presumption that he is irresponsible and forbidden to be in any park area unless attended by a person responsible as an adult.
