In this month's edition I am highlighting the main programs and projects the City has accomplished during the Budget year 2018 – 2019. Following this month I will provide you with current happenings in each department of the City. I will also include up to date police statistics.

So now let's take a look at the recent police statistics and what the City has accomplished during this past year from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019:

Completed Projects and Program for the Year July 2018 thru June 2019

- New Police Building, Equipment and Fencing
- City Hall Internal Remodel Including Carpet and Paint including the City Hall North West Wall Replacement
- Purchase of New Shop Building material for new Public Works Shop and Office
- Snow Lift Station (through the bid process) the cost of the station came in just over \$300,000 less than was estimated.
- Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade including Replacement of influent Flow Meter and replacement of old exterior lighting with energy efficient LED's.
- Added a New Code Enforcement Officer which has resulted in a number of properties being cleaned up as well as currently working on 4 properties to abate them either for criminal activity or for accumulation of garbage and junk vehicles. Abated one property for a cost of just over \$4,000.
- Drafted new Ordinance to abate properties that require regular visits from the police dealing with criminal activities.
- Purchased used sewer TV system from Roseburg Urban Sanitary Association for a savings of nearly \$130,000 if we would have had to purchase a new system.
- Started a K-9 Program, almost completely funded through donations, to be able to search for drugs.
- Worked with School District to place a School Resource Officer in the School District.
- Responded to emergency sewer line collapse on Oak Street, replacing approximately 400 feet of new main.
- Purchased 3 new police vehicles.
- Permitted 30 new single family homes from which 22 have been purchased and have new families living in them.
- Urban Renewal Agency received \$213,000 in loan payments from the CORE project.
- Overlaid Cary Street with 2" asphalt overlay.
- Received another clean financial audit
