It seems like the last couple of months have gone by slower than any of the rest I have lived through in my 64 years. I think we have all had enough of this thing called COVID-19. However, with the Governor announcing that Douglas County can now move to Phase II of the reopening plan, we will continue to see steps taken to get our lives back on track. During the past month, the City has moved forward and completed several important projects. The first being the City Hall face lift. We are still lacking the 2 feet of rock facade that will go across the bottom of the front of City Hall. This material has been on back order for the last two weeks and is slated to arrive this week. City Hall has been outfitted with all the necessary safety items and is now reopened for business. With the County approved to move to phase II, we are reopening the Community Center for all uses. This includes the Library, Teen Center, Senior Center, and rentals for the grand room. These facilities will be using the new guidelines provided in the Governor's guidance found at https://govstatus.egov.com/or-covid-19. The parks are open but still subject to several items that are not. Basically, the green space is open and depending on the event the restrooms may be open on a limited basis. Also, play structures are still closed due to the lack of controlling distancing in these confined areas. Garage and vard sales are ok to run on the weekends. In general, most businesses have been given the green light to reopen following the Governor's restrictions on these.
